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

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





1 CONTEXTUALIZING THE DISTRICT

Economic

- DC is economically segmented between Northwest DC and Anacostia.
- The Urban institute found that the average tract household income rose for the top 10% by \$43,000 whereas the purchasing power of the lowest 10% only grew by \$3,100









SAFETY

- Rock Creek Park largely divides the DC Crime.
- Violence east of Rock Creek has increased over the years, particularly in Northeast and Southeast DC.
- According to the DC Policy Center, children in high crime areas are less likely to play outside, have increased stress levels, poor mental health, and tend to fall behind in school.



PHYSICAL ACTIVITY DESERTS

- DC Active Kids describes Physical
 Activity Deserts as "urban areas in which it is difficult to find a safe, affordable place to engage with physical activity."
- Despite the abundant greenspace, DC contains a variety of Physical Activity
 Deserts, particularly in Ward 7 wherein children must walk over a mile in highcrime areas to recreation spaces.








- Improves reading and math achievement, reduces grade repetition, and decreases the probability of suspensions and expulsions.
- Shown to have long-term impacts and result in higher graduation rates, higher adult wages, and a lower likelihood of adult poverty

OVER TIME

 In 1998, DC was in the 95th percentile of revenues per-pupil and exceeded all states in funding.

CURRENT STATE

- DC continues to spend more per-pupil than most schools nationwide, and
- Issues educational equity reports each year for transparency.

- Eclectic mix of commercial structures (both purpose built and modified) along both sides of 18th Street



























